- **Know-how** trade secrets
- Copyright literary, including digital work, research notes, software
- Design rights product shape and configuration
- Brands goodwill and reputation



IPR: Copyright

- •Bundles of rights to reproduce, rent, broadcast or to stop parties exploiting work
- •Literary work- books, articles, drawings, digital works
- Musical work music
- -Artistic work sculpture, photograph
- •Computer generated computer program



•UK No system of registration- protected as soon as recorded
