



<u>Conventional – 1 year LPC</u>

Adv

- Focus on Study
- Acquire Sound Knowledge of various subjects
- May have a more informed choice of areas of law
- Have a social life!!!
- Go into industry and focus on this

Disady

- Lack of practical experience
- Course is very intense
- Expensive if not funded/part funded by firm



So... Which Option? (Advantages & Disadvantages of Each Route)

Emerging – 2 year LPC

Adv

- Invaluable practical experience to assist studies
- Course not as intense as full-time
- Lecturers more sympathetic due to work commitments (apparently!!)
- Can get straight into the industry
- Good combination where studying and working in the same practice area (e.g of Media Client)
- Adopt good time management skills
- Can obtain vital assistance from colleagues

Disady

- NO SOCIAL LIFE!!!!
- Have to study after work!

- 9am 9:15am Get to office and acclimatize!
- 9:15am 9:30am Coffee & check mail
- 9:30 10:00am Admin* includes attendance notes on files from previous day/ timesheets etc. Discuss with supervisor
- 10 1pm Fee-earning work
- 1 2pm Lunch
- 2 2:30pm Internal meetings if required
- 2:30 3:30pm Marketing*
- 3:30 6:30pm (or 7pm or 8pm!) Fee earning work

IMPORTANT CONSIDERATIONS

- Think about your passion(s)
- Consider the type of firm you would like to work in
 - Size
 - Practice Areas
 - Firm culture
- Consider your USP
- When applying, be honest BUT creative (!)
- Research the firms you apply to (ESPECIALLY when called for interviews)
- Speak to people in firms / areas of law you are interested in
- Keep up to date with changes and current issues in practice area(s) of prospective employers.



AT THE INTERVIEW

- Dress Code (Needn't say anymore!)
- BE YOURSELF (as far as possible!)
- Make sure you know your CV well BEFORE you attend!
- Be observant & listen very carefully
- Think before you answer questions
- Be as honest as you can (but always try and turn weaknesses to strengths)
- Think commercially *remember: law firms ARE businesses!!*
- Ask intelligent questions, BUT
- DON'T 'Over-do' it!
